



Safety of regulator's staff



Essential:

- Home office regime for staff to the extent possible
- Limited opening hours for public
- External and internal meetings made virtual or cancelled
- Suspension of official travels


Additional:

- Suspension, limiting (or performance online where possible) of operations:
 - Scheduled and unscheduled inspections/controls
 - Public hearings
 - Registering petitions/ declarations/ requests/ extensions/ withdrawals of permissive acts

Extensive:

- Provision of personal protective equipment to staff e.g. face masks
- Mandatory list of 'one-stop' contacts for all departments, with a phone number and email address
- Company cars shall be kept at least 50% of fuel level at all times

Regulated entities' measures (1 – Dispatch centres)





E.g. half of the dispatchers work in a continuous 24-hour shift for two weeks, and the other half of the dispatchers are at home ready. In this way a continuous operation of the dispatch center is ensured even when one of the dispatchers gets infected. In such case the entire lineup is ready to be replaced immediately.

Regulated entities' measures (2 – TSOs/DSOs)

- Partial **home office** regime for staff
- Setting up plans for in-house isolation of key operational staff in shifts in case of higher level of pandemic spread

Limiting or postponing of network maintenances

- Cancellation of all planned outages until further notice
- Interruptions only in emergency cases and/or in the removal of failures
- Non-realization of new connections except those that are absolutely necessary, disconnections forbidden

- Remote meter reading or its calculation based on the consumption data of the same month of the previous year with later adjustments possible
- Closing of customer service centres
- Enhanced **online availability of services** through web platforms

Issuing invoices to consumers based on the average consumption of a given reference period

Deferral of extraordinary tariff review

Other measures

Licenses

- **Expiry of the licenses** during the epidemic is **waived**
- Procedural changes in licensing regarding court and prosecution certificates currently not required
- ❖ 3-month extension of deadlines for operation for licensed and unlicensed generation facilities


Imports

- ❖ Temporary restrictions on commercial operations for electricity import from countries other than the Energy Community Contracting Parties
- ❖ Consideration of invoking force majeure clause of PPAs with IPPs and with LNG import orders

Miscellaneous

- No sanctions imposed if utilities fail to comply the technical quality standards of the power or natural gas services
- ❖ 3-month salaries reduction as a sign of solidarity – funds given to a special economic rescue fund
- Scheduled or unannounced state inspection suspended
- Extensions for some reporting obligations of market players
- Logo encouraging others to stay at home

Some early market observations (2)



Other early observations:

- 10-15 % reduced daily average power consumption, up to 30% in touristic regions in Austria
- Up to 25% reduced daily power consumption in April in Albania
- Peak demand dropped by as much as 46% in Peru (comparison: March 16th to April 18th), which affected the energy mix share of renewables surged from 60% to 98%
- There is no clear pattern for fluctuation trends for the share of household consumption in total electricity consumption and to the collection rate (billed vs. collected) for electricity bills

Summary (1)

- Staff protection measures (shifts, home office etc.) have been introduced along the whole energy supply chain.
- Emergency plans and procedures for staff and operations are either revised/complemented or in force.
- All avoidable maintenance/controlling exercises and extracurricular activities are suspended.

Summary (2)

- All customer/petitioner issues are solved in a remote manner or, where impossible, suspended.
- Deferrals in payment and special protective measures in case of nonpayment for continuous energy supply are widely used.
- There is no unified pattern for electricity market signals, but in many cases the overall energy consumption is lower than usual, whereas the consumption among households has increased.
- As opposed to to electricity, many regulators observe higher consumption figures for natural gas.
