Key context

- The 8° WFER will take place on March Tuesday 21- Friday 24, 2023 in Lima, Peru
- The venue is the International Convention Center of Lima:
 - Previous events: Pan American Games, APEC Summit, Olympic Committee
- **No participation fee.** Services at additional cost (meals, accommodation, international travels)
- Post-Covid conditions will consider technology deployment (some sessions will have live streaming)



Central Theme

- *“The Energy Transformation Challenge: competitiveness and sustainability of energy markets, opportunities and achievements”*
- Pillars: competitiveness, institutionality, energy transition and universal energy access
- Official languages: English and Spanish



Several considerations

- We are expecting 1000-1500 participants (national and international)
- Plenary Sessions
 - Most attended activity. Let's make our statement as regulators!
- Concurrent Sessions
 - Attendants will break down into focus areas (pillars). Be specific!
- High Level Round Tables
 - Only **with previous registration**. Just for High Level authorities (Commissioners, Board members, Managers or former members) up to 40 participants.
- Regulatory Training Day
 - Blocks of training that can be taken separately. Be mindful of the topics you want to discuss and the ones you want to learn from an expert. It's a 2 hour training, more than 1 trainer can participate

Global reach

- All regions should be represented within all the activities (speakers, trainers...)

Sectorial balance:

- Comprehensive panels including government and stakeholders: regulators, academics, consumers, financial institutions, industry, international organizations, etc.

Gender perspective: we want to go beyond Mexico!

- Woman in Energy panel on exclusive energy topics
- All activities should consider gender equality
