



Third-Party Access for LNG - Relevant EU Regulation (1)



Regulation (EU) 2009/73 concerning common rules for the internal market in natural gas

Article 36

- ➤ Paragraph 1 -> prescribes <u>under which conditions</u> major new gas infrastructure (like LNG facilities) may upon request be exempted, for a defined period of time
- Paragraph 2. -> prescribes that exemption shall also apply to <u>significant increases of capacity in existing infrastructure</u> and to modifications of such infrastructure which enable the development of new sources of gas supply.

Regulation (EU) 715/2009 on conditions for access to the natural gas transmission networks

Article 15

prescribes <u>third-party access services</u> concerning LNG facilities

Third-Party Access for LNG - Relevant EU Regulation (2)



Regulation (EU) 2022/2576 enhancing solidarity through better coordination of gas purchases, reliable price benchmarks and exchanges of gas across borders

- Article 12 prescribes that by 28 February 2023, LNG facility operators shall set up or make use of an existing transparent and non-discriminatory booking platform for LNG facility users to re-sell their contracted capacity on the secondary market
- ➤ Article 13 prescribes that by 28 February 2023 LNG facility operators shall publish all the information required by Article 19 of Regulation (EC) No 715/2009 on a European LNG Transparency Platform, in a transparent and user-friendly manner
- ✓ Croatian LNG facility operator has fulfilled provisions of Article 12 and Article 13 as well as regarding Transparency

Third-Party Access for LNG – Croatian Regulation



Gas Market Act (Official Gazette, No. 18/18 and 23/20) prescribes following:

- > the operator of the LNG terminal is obliged to ensure **efficient and non-discriminatory access** to the LNG terminal
- > access to the LNG terminal is provided through the application of regulated third-party access, whereas access to the LNG supply point is provided through the application of negotiated third-party access
- regulated third-party access is applied objectively and equally for all participants in the gas market
- > negotiated third-party access is based on the commercial terms of access to the LNG supply point, which are subject to negotiation
- contractual relations and general terms of use of the LNG terminal are prescribed by Rules of Regulation for LNG terminal (Official Gazette, No. 87/21 and 72/22) which are adopted by LNG terminal operator (before adopting the Rules of Regulation for LNG terminal the operator of the LNG terminal is obliged to obtain the consent from HERA)

Third-Party Access for Croatian LNG – Conclusion



Regarding LNG facility in Croatia:

- > LNG terminal management is a regulated energy activity
- LNG tariff is determined by HERA for the regulatory period 2021-2040 by method of setting a regulatory account -> in accordance with Methodology for determination of tariff items for the unloading and send-out of liquified natural gas (Official Gazette, No. 48/18 and 79/20)
- > LNG tariff is applied equally for all LNG terminal users for the whole regulatory period
- ➤ LNG terminal operator <u>did not submit a request for exemption regarding third-party access</u> to the LNG terminal before commissioning the terminal as a new infrastructure
