#### Background



Activity	Regulatory period	Tariffs	Degree of regulation
Transmission	5 years	Volume based tariff	Regulated Monopoly
Distribution	5 years	Volume based tariff	Regulated Monopoly
Generation *	3 years for HPP	Volume based tariff	Only 9 HPPs remain in Tariff Regulation, rest are deregulated (under 70 MW)
	1 year for TPP	Guaranteed Capacity Fee and Generation tariff	Regulated and Centrally Dispatched
Market Operator **	1 year	Service fee	
Supply	1 year	End consumer tariffs - USS, PSS, SoLR	Regulated PSOs (Free Suppliers starting to emerge)

<sup>\*\*</sup> Market operators (GENEX, BMO) were licensed by GNERC in 2020, but operations have not yet started as the market has not yet opened.

## Current domestic electricity sector/market development

- The market opening date is July 1, 2024\*
- For suppliers, new tariffs have been established for the period of validity from January 1, 2024 to July 1, 2024 (USS, PSS, SoLR)
- GNERC establishes the so-called "block" tariffs for household users (Based on electricity consumed in 1 month) and there is no cross-subsidy of the electricity End-user tariff\*\*
- Post energy crisis did not affect the end-user tariff of electricity

<sup>\*</sup>The opening of the market has been postponed from July 1, 2023 to July 1, 2024

<sup>\*\*</sup>Block tariffs are supplied cheap energy from tariff-regulated sources
